Through the Manufacturing 4.0 Technology Investment Program, IEDA made grants that assist small- and midsized enterprises with the adoption and integration of smart technologies into existing operations in the state. There were two award categories: The Industrial Internet of Things (IIoT) category, which provided a maximum grant of \$25,000 for the purchase of specialized hardware or software to enable Industry 4.0 equipment; and the Equipment category, which provided a maximum award of \$50,000 for the purchase of specialized Industry 4.0 equipment. Applicants could apply for more than one grant, but IEDA will not award any single business more than a lifetime total aggregate amount of \$75,000.

IEDA entered into contracts with grantees that provided for a twelve-month project completion period. It has been IEDA's recommendation to extend the Project Completion Date by 12 months for companies that have encountered delays in receipt of equipment delivery that prevented them from completing proposed projects by the contractual completion date.
